# The History of the Club

Corinthian FC was founded in 1972 by Mr RJ Billings (snr) to provide football in a safe environment, whilst teaching the players the principles that he believed to be important in sport. The motto was simply “pro omnium beneficio”- for the benefit of all, but on the pitch the principles were simple; “Hard, but fair”. Losing wasn’t considered before the game, but if the result went against us then the players were taught to take it graciously.

For the first ten years of the club’s existence we were pleased to welcome such teams as Tottenham, Charlton and Norwich amongst other league teams as well as county and district representative sides as our opposition. On top of these games there were many regular visitors to Gay Dawn Farm from local clubs making up a fixture list of over 60 games per season.

During the 1980s with the arrival of an experienced football manager, Mr Tony Sitford, we progressed from youth football into men’s football playing in the old Southern League. This level of football by a totally amateur club made us unique, but caused problems in the long run in attracting new players. Into the 1990’s we dropped back down to the Kent League and enjoyed many a season in this set up.

Early into the new century we reviewed the whole structure of our football club and decided that we had lost our roots in youth football and this was having a detrimental effect on our senior side. So, we decided to withdraw temporarily from senior football, whilst we rebuilt the lower levels of the club. In 2008 we had managed to create a club running 5 sides, from 13 years old through to 18 years old and it became obvious that we needed to consider the next step in our restructuring. For two seasons we had a liaison with Welling United, integrating a senior side within Welling United and developed a reserve side initially playing in Kent Division 2 (season 2008/09) and then moving on (2009/10) into the Suburban League South Division. This partnership has now come to an end.

When the opportunity came for us to re-enter senior football as Corinthian Football Club, we did not hesitate to take it. Probably 2 years too soon, but the challenge was one we were keen to take. We introduced a second senior side playing in the Suburban League to help us progress our u18’s into men’s football.

The 2010 / 11 season saw Corinthian FC running two senior sides one in the Kent Football League Premier Division and one in the Suburban League South Division plus three youth sides – u14, u15 and u18 in the Kent Youth League. For the 2011/12 season as well as all the above, Corinthian FC had an u18 side in the Ryman Youth League. We feel that that this fills the gap from Kent Youth League to senior football, enabling us to offer a true progression for all our players. The 2012/13, 14/15, 15/16, 17/18, 18/19 and 19/20 seasons saw the addition of u13 and u15 team playing in the Kent Youth League.

After untimely ends to the 2019/20 & 2020/21 seasons, when the boys were flying high, we are delighted to have retained the main squad, with the addition of some of last season u18’s.

Corinthian Football Club are delighted to have been promoted into the Isthmian League Division 1 South East for the 2021/22 season and are looking forward to the challenge, to visiting new grounds and making new friends.

For our 21/22 campaign we continue with sides in the Suburban League Premier Division, Isthmian u18 East Division as well as the Isthmian South East Division.

I am delighted to welcome Ashford United FC players, officials, supporters, and today's match officials to Gay Dawn Farm for what should be an excellent afternoon of football – Corinthian FC's first home match in the Pitching In Isthmian league. We are very excited in this next leg of our journey – we feel the management and players fully deserve this opportunity and are excited to see how we fare amongst these sides.

## Ashford United's Potted History



Ashford United Football Club was formed in 1891 with some varying degrees of success until the team ceased in 1928. In April 1930, Sir Charles Igglesden presided over a meeting to form a senior football club in Ashford and subsequently applied to compete in the Kent League, FA Cup and Kent Senior Cup. It was around then that Ashford Town came into existence, rather than Ashford United, and acquired its nickname of 'The Nuts & Bolts' as many of the members were from the ranks of the engineers in the railway works.

It was cup football that was to provide the greatest success for Town, reaching the first round proper of the FA Cup as a Kent League side in 1959/60, losing 1-0 to Crystal Palace. In the 1960's, Town reached the first round of the FA Cup on four occasions, falling to league opposition each time. Further honours arrived with success in the Kent Senior Cup in 1959 and 1963. In 1972/73, Town reached the semi-finals of the FA Trophy.

During the 1990's, manager Neil Cugley produced an entertaining and successful side. Highlights included a first round FA Cup match with Fulham, witnessed by a capacity crowd of 3,300 at Homelands with Sky TV highlights. The result was an impressive 2-2 draw; the replay at Craven Cottage saw the game into extra-time with Town eventually losing 5-3. In 1996/97, Ashford drew Watford away in the second-round, losing 5-0.

In 2009/10, following a Boardroom fall-out, the club's future was put in the balance following the winding up of Ashford Town Football Club but now, under the new name of Ashford United, the club continues to progress.

The 'new' United was formed in 2011, resurrecting a name used by the town's football club around the advent of the twentieth century and, in the truest form, represents a 'phoenix club', rising from the ashes of financial ruin and being run by the Crosbie family with the help of members of the local community.

Ashford United are currently in the Bet Victor League South East Division. After finishing second in two consecutive seasons, ultimately losing out to Whyteleafe and Phoenix Sports respectively. The 2016-17 season finally brought success for AUFC who became league champions earning their place for promotion into the Bostik League.

This was a much deserved reward for the hard work of the manager and the playing team and of course the team involved in the running of the football club and all it's very loyal supporters.

Our Management team consists of Tommy Warrilow and Alex O'Brien, Coach Louis Dean and Physio Ben Coles.

Good afternoon and welcome to our first home fixture as a Step Four football club. I was delighted for everyone at the club that we managed to secure promotion through the end of season FA non-league restructure. The promotion was a well-deserved reflection of our hard work and efforts over the past two shortened seasons, we would have of course preferred to win promotion on the pitch, but when this was not going to be a possibility with COVID and season curtailments, PPG was the next best solution. The start of this league campaign on paper, could not have been much harder. An opening day trip to Hythe, followed by Ashford and then a trip to Cray Valley on Monday. All three are teams, that everyone is backing heavily to do well this season and I am certainly expecting both Ashford and Cray Valley to be up challenging for the title come the end of the season. Beating Hythe on the opening day was a fantastic result and gave the team confidence and takes the pressure off securing those first points of the season in a new division. Jack Mahoney scored a fantastic free kick and was man of the match for his all-action display and there is no better feeling than a last-minute winner and ours came courtesy of the hard work and endeavour of Luke Tanner. We defended well throughout the game, riding out luck at times, but we worked incredibly hard and deserved the three points. The only negative of the day was losing Frankie Morgan to injury in the first half and he now will spend a prolonged period on the side lines as he recovers from a broken collarbone, we obviously wish Frankie all the best in his recovery and hope to see him back out on the pitch as soon as possible. Last Saturday saw us travel to Badshot Lea in the FA Cup, currently top of the Combined Counties league and before our visit, unbeaten this season. The performance was at no stage vintage Corinthian and there is a lot to work on and improve on, but again, we dug deep and Oscar's goal on half time shifted the momentum back in our favour. It was great to get both Louie Clarke and Charlie Edmundson on the score sheet and both will have a big role to play this season with the goal scoring threat they possess. The win at Badshot saw us in Monday's 1st Qualifying round draw and saw us drawn at home to Isthmian Premier Kent side Folkestone Invicta. Folkestone will of course be heavy favourites but being at home is good for us and hopefully we will get a good number of people through the gate to earn the club some money and if we can give a good account of ourselves, it will give us an outside chance of progressing into the next round, equalling the clubs best run in the FA Cup.

I am pleased that we have managed to retain every member of the squad from last year, with the exception of Adam O'Neill, who has decided to take some time away from the game and focus on his business. We have promoted Charlie Edmundson, Brandon Davey and Harry Lashley from our 23s and all have settled in well, but in the case of Harry and Brandon have had their chances limited so far due to COVID and injury but will be important players for us this season. We have also seen the return of Cameron Gyeabour and Conor Johnson to the first team following periods away from the club. Lastly, I am delighted to welcome Paul Sawyer, Steve Devereux and Lauren King to the club and they form this season's management team along with myself and Jake Housego.

This weekend is as tough as they come, but I would not want it any other way. We have worked so hard to get into this division and we are going to embrace the challenges that lie ahead. Ashford will be a formidable opponent, they have a quality, experienced management team and a squad full of experience at this level and above. They suffered a disappointing defeat to Chatham in the FA Cup on Tuesday night, so will no doubt be looking to bounce back today and we will certainly need to be at our best to get anything out of today's game. But realistically, we could be saying that each week this season!!

# THE NON-LEAGUE PAPER



ESSENTIAL READING FOR FOLLOWERS OF THE NATIONAL GAME

THE FA's restructure at Steps 4-6 this summer solved some problems but not all.

Clubs who had performed consistently over the curtailed seasons of 2019-20 and 2020-21 were awarded promotion on points-per-game.

In total, 110 clubs were upwardly moved as a new Northern Premier League Midlands division was formed at Step 4, two new Step 5 divisions administered by the Combined Counties League and the United Counties League and the Step 6 structure reduced to 17 divisions.

But vacancies across Steps 1-4, due to the resignations of clubs over the past two years, still remained although it was never the FA's intention to fill them as part of the restructure.

Instead, the vacancies will be filled ahead of the 2022-23 season via reprieves as laid down in the FA rules.

Providing no club goes under or fails its ground grading during this season, this is what should happen:

At Step 2, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (four clubs in total). The bottom clubs in National League North and South will be relegated (two clubs in total). Step 2 is increasing to 24 teams in each league from the 2022-23 season.

At Step 3, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (eight clubs in total). Of the 16 clubs finishing in relegation positions, seven will be reprieved, comprising the clubs finishing 4th bottom in each Step 3 division plus three of the four clubs that finish 3rd bottom with the best unweighted points-per-game record. The 3rd bottom club with the worst PPG record across the Step, plus all 2nd bottom and bottom placed clubs will be relegated.

At Step 4, each champion and play-off winner is promoted (16 clubs in total). Sixteen Step 5 champion clubs are automatically promoted and replace the bottom and 2nd bottom clubs at Step 4. Nine clubs with the best points-per-game are reprieved due to the vacancies at Steps 1-4 and the number of clubs at Step 2 increasing. This will leave seven Step 4 clubs playing off against seven Step 5 runners-up with the remaining eligible Step 5 clubs promoted.

Although reprieves are usually awarded to clubs with the best PPG records, the FA Alliance Committee has the power to vary that model.
