THE HISTORY OF THE CLUB

Corinthian FC was founded in 1972 by Mr RJ Billings (snr) to provide football in a safe environment, whilst teaching the players the principles that he believed to be important in sport. The motto was simply “pro omnium beneficio” - for the benefit of all, but on the pitch the principles were simple; “Hard, but fair”. Losing wasn’t considered before the game, but if the result went against us then the players were taught to take it graciously.

For the first ten years of the club’s existence we were pleased to welcome such teams as Tottenham, Charlton and Norwich amongst other league teams as well as county and district representative sides as our opposition. On top of these games there were many regular visitors to Gay Dawn Farm from local clubs making up a fixture list of over 60 games per season.

During the 1980s with the arrival of an experienced football manager, Mr Tony Sitford, we progressed from youth football into men’s football playing in the old Southern League. This level of football by a totally amateur club made us unique, but caused problems in the long run in attracting new players. Into the 1990’s we dropped back down to the Kent League and enjoyed many a season in this set up.

Early into the new century we reviewed the whole structure of our football club and decided that we had lost our roots in youth football and this was having a detrimental effect on our senior side. So, we decided to withdraw temporarily from senior football, whilst we rebuilt the lower levels of the club. In 2008 we had managed to create a club running 5 sides, from 13 years old through to 18 years old and it became obvious that we needed to consider the next step in our restructuring. For two seasons we had a liaison with Welling United, integrating a senior side within Welling United and developed a reserve side initially playing in Kent Division 2 (season 2008/09) and then moving on (2009/10) into the Suburban League South Division. This partnership has now come to an end.

When the opportunity came for us to re-enter senior football as Corinthian Football Club, we did not hesitate to take it. Probably 2 years too soon, but the challenge was one we were keen to take. We introduced a second senior side playing in the Suburban League to help us progress our u18’s into men’s football.

The 2010 / 11 season saw Corinthian FC running two senior sides one in the Kent Football League Premier Division and one in the Suburban League South Division plus three youth sides – u14, u15 and u18 in the Kent Youth League. For the 2011/12 season as well as all the above, Corinthian FC had an u18 side in the Ryman Youth League. We feel that that this fills the gap from Kent Youth League to senior football, enabling us to offer a true progression for all our players. The 2012/13, 14/15, 15/16, 17/18 ,18/19 and 19/20 seasons saw the addition of u13 and u15 team playing in the Kent Youth League.

After untimely ends to the 2019/20 & 2020/21 seasons, when the boys were flying high, we are delighted to have retained the main squad, with the addition of some of last season u18’s.

After two seasons in the Isthmian East Division, for the 2023/23 season Corinthian Football Club were relegated back to the Premier Division of the Southern Counties East Football League for the 2023/24 season, where we very closely missed out on promotion losing in the play off final on penalties.

At the end of the 2024/25 season Michael Golding left his role as Corinthian First team manager after 10 ½ years in charge. Mason East takes over the dugout for the start of the 2026/27 season with Myles Warren as his assistant.

THE HISTORY OF RUSTHALL



Rusthall - A Brief History

The club were first registered with the Kent County Football Association on June 17th 1899 when the club joined the newly formed Tunbridge Wells League. The Rustics' first success came in 1905 when the league was won in convincing style. The 1920s saw the club up among the best locally with the Kent Junior Cup Group A being won in 1924. The club were champions of the Tunbridge Wells League in 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926 and again in 1930. The success continued through the 1930s with more league titles and another Kent Junior Cup in 1935.

The Rustics were unable to continue these successes after the war and these were lean times for the club. In the 1970s, the club were close to folding but just managed to keep going largely thanks to the hard work of the then secretary Peter Smith with just one side in the Tonbridge League.

The 1980s saw an influx of new young players and in 1982, the club won Division One of the Tonbridge League. At this point, Derek Seal took on the role of Chairman. One of his first tasks was to get the club into the Kent Amateur (now Kent County) League and the club lifted the Division Two Title at the first attempt in 1983-84. More success followed in the 1984-85 season when the Division One Title was secured on the last day of the season with a 1-0 win at Paddock Wood. After several embarrassing incidents at the council-owned Southwood Road recreation ground, the club obtained the use of a field at Jockey Farm in the village. After a lot of hard work by the committee, the ground met the league's ground grading criteria for intermediate football.

An amalgamation with Rusthall Boys FC was a big step in making the club what it is today with the Rustics currently running three men's teams and close to 20 youth teams from Under 6 through to Under 18.

In the 2016/17 season, Rusthall finished in second place in the SCEFL First Division. This meant promotion to the Premier where the following year we luckily held onto our place at this level despite finishing in 19th place. The following season there was no such luck though as another 19th position saw the club relegated to the First Division.

A quick return was only denied by the Coronavirus pandemic where the season was declared null and void with the club in an excellent position for promotion. With the same happening again in 2020/21, the FA chose to combine results from the two unfinished seasons to reward the best performers and this meant we were granted promotion and a place back in the Premier Division for the 2021/22 campaign.

A tough season saw Rusthall survive on the last day with a thrilling 4-4 draw at home to Erith and Belvedere. This was followed by the most successful season in the club's long history— a 6th place finish in the league and finishing above our local rivals, Tunbridge Wells. The following season was more of a challenge but the team bounced back as the club celebrated its 125th anniversary. Our special edition first-team shirt included the names of supporters, players, staff and club legends in honour of the occasion, and a book was launched documenting the history of our wonderful football club. Following an incredible unbeaten run in the league which stretched 19 games from November to April, Rusthall finished just outside the playoffs in 6th place, eclipsing the achievement of two seasons before and, once again, finishing ahead of Tunbridge Wells.

Last season, Rusthall went one better— winning the SCEFL Challenge Cup with a 4-0 win over Bearsted in the final at Flamingo Park, and finishing 3rd in the league. A playoff win on penalties, with Reece Hobbs the hero, was followed by a disappointing defeat in the final to Punjab United, who won on penalties following a 1-1 draw after extra time.

The club continues to grow on and off the pitch, led by manager, Jimmy Anderson, and chairman, Dean Jacquin. The Derek Seal Suite has been transformed into a fantastic hospitality lounge and now features an impressive balcony giving guests an impressive view of the fantastic Jockey Farm pitch. The clubhouse, shop, and food hut continue to generate important revenue for the club, and attendances are expected to once again be among the highest in the league, despite the relatively small size of the village of Rusthall. Jimmy Anderson and his management team have recruited well, supplementing the strong squad at their disposal with exciting new additions.

The dedication of all involved at the club continue to ensure Rusthall lead the way in local non-league football— having been just four minutes away from promotion, all in green and white will be aiming to go one better in 2026/27.

Petts Wood & Holmesdale v Erith & Belvedere

The SCEFL Premier Division returns with a busy round of midweek action, featuring seven fixtures on Tuesday evening before one more game completes the programme on Wednesday night.

Early leaders Larkfield & New Hythe put their strong start to the season to the test when they travel to Hollands & Blair. Larkfield moved to the summit following Saturday's impressive 3-1 victory over Tunbridge Wells and will be looking to keep their momentum going on the road.

Faversham Strike Force are another side who have started well. After opening with an entertaining 3-3 draw at Tunbridge Wells, they followed that with Saturday's 1-0 victory over Phoenix Sports. They now travel to Bearsted, who began their league campaign with a 2-0 win against Chislehurst Glebe.

Beckenham Town welcome AFC Greenwich Borough in another eye-catching fixture. Beckenham marked their Premier Division return with an opening-day victory over Hollands & Blair, while last season's First Division champions Greenwich Borough will be looking to establish themselves at their new level.

There should be plenty of interest at Corinthian too, where Rusthall are the visitors. The Rustics claimed their first league victory of the season in dramatic fashion on Saturday, with Lekan Osideko scoring in the seventh minute of stoppage time to secure a 2-1 win over Fisher.

Fisher themselves have a quick opportunity to respond when they welcome Phoenix Sports. Both sides will be looking for a positive result after defeats at the weekend, with Phoenix particularly keen to get their first points of the campaign on the board.

Snodland Town host Kennington having taken three points from their opening two league games. They began with a 1-0 victory over Rusthall before suffering a 2-0 defeat at Chislehurst Glebe on Saturday.

Tuesday's programme is completed by Tunbridge Wells against Chislehurst Glebe. Wells have already been involved in plenty of goals during the opening weeks, while Glebe head to the Culverden with renewed confidence after Saturday's first league win of the season.

Wednesday Night

The Premier Division action continues on Wednesday when Petts Wood & Holmesdale welcome Erith & Belvedere.

Petts Wood & Holmesdale made a memorable start under their new name when late goals from Omotunmise Akanni and Ryan Mahal helped them to a dramatic 3-2 opening-day victory at Phoenix Sports.

Erith & Belvedere, meanwhile, had the honour of getting the entire Premier Division season underway with their Friday night opener against AFC Greenwich Borough and now return to league action under the lights.

With eight Premier Division fixtures across two nights, there should be plenty of movement in the early table as clubs look to build momentum ahead of another busy weekend.



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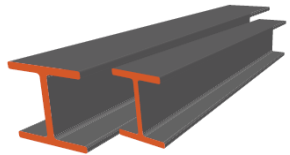
