THE HISTORY OF THE CLUB

Corinthian FC was founded in 1972 by Mr RJ Billings (snr) to provide football in a safe environment, whilst teaching the players the principles that he believed to be important in sport. The motto was simply “pro omnium beneficio” - for the benefit of all, but on the pitch the principles were simple; “Hard, but fair”. Losing wasn’t considered before the game, but if the result went against us then the players were taught to take it graciously.

For the first ten years of the club’s existence we were pleased to welcome such teams as Tottenham, Charlton and Norwich amongst other league teams as well as county and district representative sides as our opposition. On top of these games there were many regular visitors to Gay Dawn Farm from local clubs making up a fixture list of over 60 games per season.

During the 1980s with the arrival of an experienced football manager, Mr Tony Sitford, we progressed from youth football into men’s football playing in the old Southern League. This level of football by a totally amateur club made us unique, but caused problems in the long run in attracting new players. Into the 1990’s we dropped back down to the Kent League and enjoyed many a season in this set up.

Early into the new century we reviewed the whole structure of our football club and decided that we had lost our roots in youth football and this was having a detrimental effect on our senior side. So, we decided to withdraw temporarily from senior football, whilst we rebuilt the lower levels of the club. In 2008 we had managed to create a club running 5 sides, from 13 years old through to 18 years old and it became obvious that we needed to consider the next step in our restructuring. For two seasons we had a liaison with Welling United, integrating a senior side within Welling United and developed a reserve side initially playing in Kent Division 2 (season 2008/09) and then moving on (2009/10) into the Suburban League South Division. This partnership has now come to an end.

When the opportunity came for us to re-enter senior football as Corinthian Football Club, we did not hesitate to take it. Probably 2 years too soon, but the challenge was one we were keen to take. We introduced a second senior side playing in the Suburban League to help us progress our u18’s into men’s football.

The 2010 / 11 season saw Corinthian FC running two senior sides one in the Kent Football League Premier Division and one in the Suburban League South Division plus three youth sides – u14, u15 and u18 in the Kent Youth League. For the 2011/12 season as well as all the above, Corinthian FC had an u18 side in the Ryman Youth League. We feel that that this fills the gap from Kent Youth League to senior football, enabling us to offer a true progression for all our players. The 2012/13, 14/15, 15/16, 17/18, 18/19 and 19/20 seasons saw the addition of u13 and u15 team playing in the Kent Youth League.

After untimely ends to the 2019/20 & 2020/21 seasons, when the boys were flying high, we are delighted to have retained the main squad, with the addition of some of last season u18’s.

After two seasons in the Isthmian East Division, for the 2023/23 season Corinthian Football Club were relegated back to the Premier Division of the Southern Counties East Football League for the 2023/24 season, where we very closely missed out on promotion losing in the play off final on penalties.

At the end of the 2024/25 season Michael Golding left his role as Corinthian First team manager after 10 ½ years in charge. Mason East takes over the dugout for the start of the 2026/27 season with Myles Warren as his assistant.

THE HISTORY OF BROADFIELD UTD FC

Broadfields United Football Club was formed in 1993 at Broadfields Sports & Social Club in Harrow. Within a year the club had grown to field 10 teams. The 1995/96 season marked the club's first in the Middlesex County Football League, with the First Team winning the Presidents Cup before securing the Division One title the following season.

By 2001/02 the club had five teams competing across Saturday and Sunday football. However, tragedy struck when a fire destroyed the Broadfields clubhouse, leaving only the changing rooms and shower facilities standing. Despite this setback, the club continued to develop. By 2003/04 the First Team remained in the Middlesex Premier Division, a Veterans side competed in the London Commercial League, and the Sunday teams enjoyed continued cup success under Chris Webster.

Silverware returned in 2011/12 as Ryan Duffy and Chris Webster guided the First Team to the Alec Smith Premier Cup, successfully defending the trophy the following season. The 2013/14 campaign saw the Reserve Team win both the Senior Reserve Division and Junior Open Cup, while the First Team made its FA Vase debut.

Promotion to Spartan South Midlands League Division One followed in 2014/15 after a dramatic injury-time winner from Sam Horan against Cricklewood Wanderers. The summer also saw James Brophy become the club's first player to move into the professional game after signing for Swindon Town.

The club adapted quickly to Step 6 football, reaching the League Cup semi-finals in its first season and finishing 11th. Meanwhile, the Sunday side completed an outstanding quadruple. In 2016/17 the First Team won the Middlesex Premier Cup for the first time, reached the Second Round of the FA Vase and the Reserve Team secured promotion to the Hertfordshire County League Premier Division.

The 2017/18 season proved historic as Broadfields secured a cup double, winning both the Middlesex Premier Cup and Spartan League Challenge Trophy, while also qualifying for the FA Cup for the first time. The Reserve Team enjoyed a successful first season in the Hertfordshire Premier Division, finishing mid-table and reaching the Anagram Records Trophy Final.

Another milestone followed in 2018/19 as the First Team achieved promotion to Step 5 after finishing runners-up with 94 points. The club also recorded its first FA Cup victory with a 3-0 win over Banstead Athletic in its debut season in the competition. Although the Reserve Team retained its Premier Division status, the difficult decision was taken to withdraw the side during the summer.

Broadfields made a strong start to life at Step 5, recording memorable victories over Dunstable Town and Hanworth Villa before defeating National League South side Hampton & Richmond Borough in the Middlesex Senior Cup later on in the season. During this period the club also moved to a new groundshare at Tithe Farm Sports & Social Club with Rayners Lane. The 2020/21 season was heavily disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic, with only 11 league matches completed.

The following season saw the club reach the Emirates FA Cup Second Round Qualifying for the first time. After Christmas, Liam Bird stepped down after five successful years as manager and was replaced by David Fox until the end of the campaign.

Following a move to the Combined Counties League Premier Division North, the club underwent a significant rebuilding process but many results went against. Sunny Tailor and Ryan Duffy took charge late in the season and guided the team to safety with an unbeaten final seven matches. The campaign also brought another major honour as Jordan Greaves scored the winning goal against Northwood to secure the club's first Middlesex Senior Charity Cup.

Ahead of the 2023/24 season Sunny Tailor became sole first-team manager, leading Broadfields to a then record ninth-place finish. The club also reached the semi-finals of the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup and narrowly lost 1-0 to National League side Barnet in the Middlesex Senior Cup at The Hive.

The 2024/25 season began with a difficult run of results, but an excellent recovery lifted the club comfortably clear of danger. The highlight came in the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup Final, where Lucas Sinclair's headed goal secured a 1-0 victory over Southall and the club's second Charity Cup triumph in three seasons.

The 2025/26 campaign became one of the finest in Broadfields United's history. The club achieved its highest-ever league finish, ending fourth in the Combined Counties Premier Division North before reaching the Play-Off Final but were sadly defeated on the day. Broadfields also reached both the Middlesex County FA Challenge Cup Final and the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup Final, underlining the continued progress made on and off the pitch despite being one of the lowest ranked sides in both of those competitions.

As the club looks ahead to the 2026/27 season, the club remains committed to competing at the highest possible level while continuing to provide opportunities for players, coaches and supporters. Built on resilience, ambition and community spirit, the club continues to write new chapters in its proud history.

Snodland Town also impressed on the road, beating Harrow Borough 3-1 with

Harry Hudson grabbing a brace, while Petts Wood & Holmesdale enjoyed the biggest win of the day, cruising to a superb 5-1 victory at Raynes Park Vale, including two goals from Charlie Clover.

There could yet be five SCEFL clubs in the next round. Corinthian drew 1-1 at Broadfields United, while SE Dons earned a 1-1 draw at Punjab United, meaning both ties will require midweek replays.

Beckenham Town, Bearsted, Erith & Belvedere, Rusthall and Tunbridge Wells all saw their FA Cup journeys come to an end.

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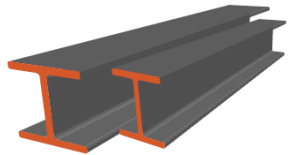
